Later it was taken away, cut to pieces, and stuffed with sweet sticky rice. It was so tasty and we enjoyed it so much that I forgot to take photos. We had a wonderful lunch there.

At the end of the day, we were dropped off at our hotel.

The next day, my guided tour was a trip to Cu Chi tunnel, a renowned place for the war torn Vietnam. Our tour guide's name was Typhoon. On our way we stopped to a place where handicrafts are made by handicapped people, mainly the victims of war and their generations. We all know about the sad effects of agent orange. They suffered a similar effect of bombing in Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The handicrafts were beautiful. Photography was not allowed in the show room so I couldn't take photos there.

From there we were taken to visit Cu Chi tunnel. During the Vietnam war, which lasted for 20 years, this underground tunnel housed 18000 people. By the time the war ended only 4000 survived! What was gained? Nothing. The tour guide was explaining sadly, and I felt in the same way. When we were growing up and were school students, we heard about Vietnam war and obviously didn't understand much. In that 20-year period we started learning and becoming politically aware, mainly when my parents were discussing it. I felt very fortunate to get this opportunity to be here.

War always makes me feel sad. I don't care whether they are Vietnamese or American, people killing people is always a very sad feeling for me. They are someone's son, someone's husband or someone's father. Today we were shown how cleverly Vietnamese faced and killed the Americans. The tunnel was amazing. It had a unique architectural structure, with several floors and branches like a spider web, more than 250 km long. It had places for dining, living, meeting, and fighting.

I sighed and sighed.


I had an evening flight to Ha Noi, and I came back to my hotel after visiting the museum.




Our very relaxing sampan ride




The highlight of today's tour was the sampan ride for nearly three hours, stopping at three different places to see the temples and going through three different caves which were very low. Sometimes we had to duck to



My cabin on Ha Long cruise




View from the balcony of my cabin.

Enjoying my tea sitting in the balcony of my cabin.




The view from my cabin. It was breath taking.

Beautiful stalactites inside the cave.






I loved to be surrounded by stalactites and stalagmites.








Floating Village

Next morning, I went to the top desk for a Tai Chi session. I was 15 minutes early and relaxed on the deck chair.




Beautiful sunrise from my cabin.
